






Y<mark>ear</mark> I Sarah

PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely.

The challenge is now open and students have until *Friday 23rd August* to log all books read during this time.

Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 will complete this challenge as part of their classroom literacy and library program.

Students in Year 3 to Year 6 will need to log their own books. A total of 20 books must be read from either the Year 3-4 list for Stage 2 and the 5-6 list from Stage 3. All students who complete the challenge will receive a certificate. Those completing the challenge for the 4th time will receive a Gold certificate and those completing the challenge for the 7th time will receive a platinum certificate.
