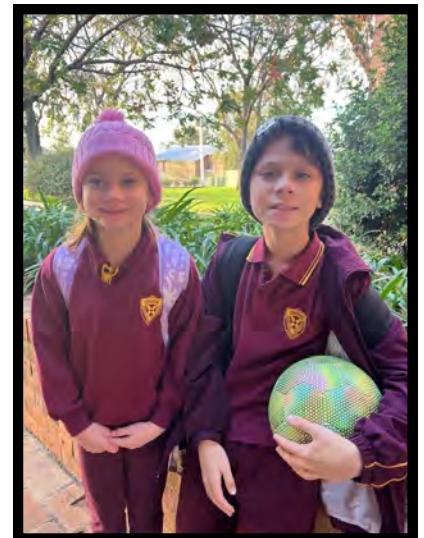


BEANIE DAY

After reading 'Bears Don't Read', Year 1 were asked to create a comic strip to reflect the storyline.

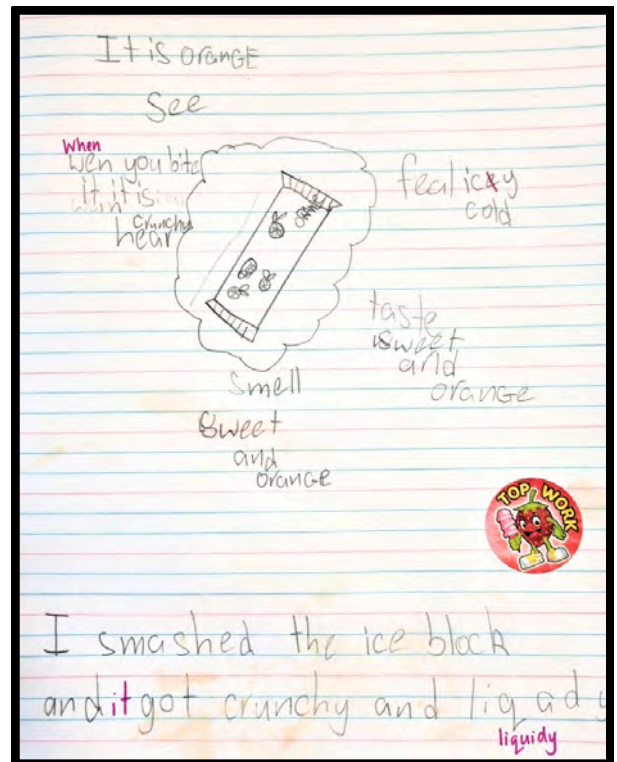
Violet created a wonderful comic strip, including amazing illustrations and cleverly planned speech bubbles. Well done Violet!

Well done Jayden!

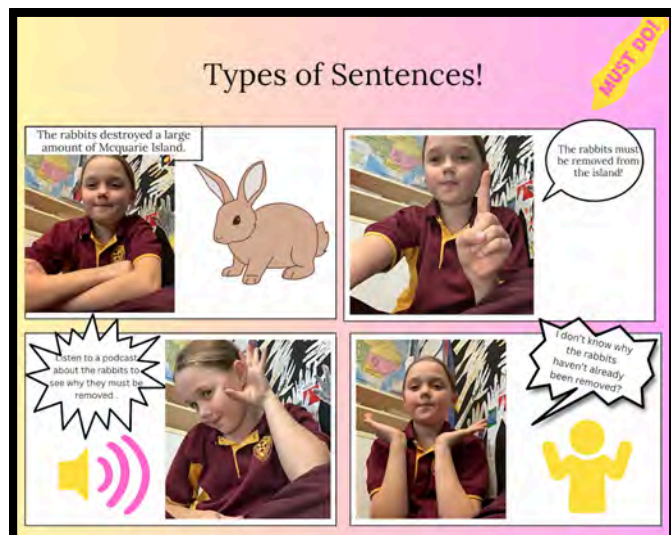


Year 5

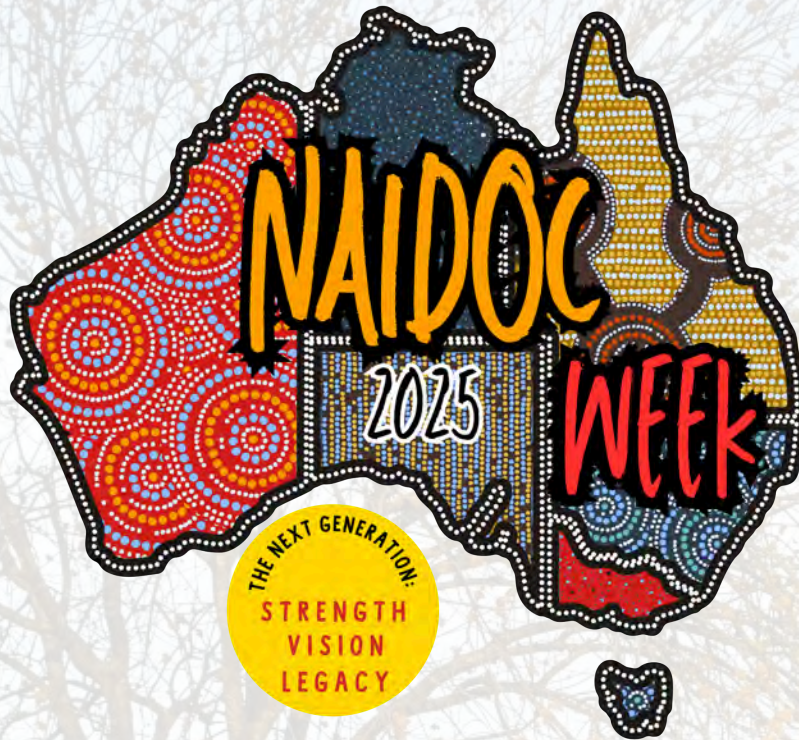
